PREFACE

We are pleased to announce the 12th Living Lakes Conference in Italy and the official celebration of the 10th anniversary of the global Living Lakes network. This conference is meant to create an international platform for an intensive exchange of knowledge and experiences of all Living Lakes partner organisations. It also provides the opportunity to benefit from the wide knowledge of certain experts giving a lecture regarding the connection of cultural values to landscape and lake protection.

Ten years ago the LIVING LAKES network was created to define and initiate best practice examples for the protection, valorisation and promotion of lake and wetland values worldwide. Adequate freshwater resources are of utmost interest considering the general state of the world's environment. However, global warming tendencies and thoughtless exploitation of nature steadily degrade water resources. It can not be taken for granted that water will last forever due to continuous abuse. Acknowledging that, freshwater is the fundamental essence of life, the survival of humanity and all living species will depend on the availability of water in a certain quantity and quality.

LAKE TRASIMENO



The picturesque landscape of Lake Trasimeno consists of ancient settlements, natural shoreline, Mediterranean wildlife and three beautiful islands.

Lake Trasimeno is Italy's fourth largest lake, located in the Northwest of the Province of Perugia in Umbria. The shallow lake has a maximum depth of six metres and a surface area of 126 square kilometres. It lies at an altitude of 257 metres above sea level. The lake has neither a major natural tributary nor an outlet and is fed solely by rainwater. The average annual precipitation amounts to 723 millimetres. Three islands are situated in the lake: Isola Polvese (64ha), Isola Maggiore (23ha), Isola Minore (6ha).

The lakeshore is sparsely inhabited and partly covered with reed, water lilies and oak forests. In the watershed corn, maize, tobacco, grapes and olives are cultivated. Fish is an important source of income for lake residents, too. Many migratory birds rest at Lake Trasimeno, among them Purple Heron, Little Bittern, Kingfisher, Tufted Duck and Crested Grebes. Increasing water consumption for agricultural and domestic use leads to a significant fall of water level.

In 1995 the Trasimeno Regional Park was founded comprising unique natural, historical and cultural sites. The region is located close to traditional routes connecting Northern Europe with Rome for thousands of years. Being easy accessible but remote and secluded at the same time, Lake Trasimeno has escaped mass tourism and is now a very special holiday location.




