

A few years later, in the early 90's, shanties and floating fishcages had grew in numbers...






Bars and other illegal structures line the lakeshore


















As the illegal structures - houses and businesses - mushroomed along the lakeshore, problems began to literally surface...

all of which are signs of disregard, abuse and disrespect for Mother Nature...


This led to the formation of the group called Save The 7 Lakes Movement in 1997, which later became Friends of the Seven Lakes Foundation in the year 2000.

Local and national media had no choice but to take notice!!!


















## ACTION TAKEN BY OUR LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT

- 1. To relocate the Informal Dweller still on the lakeshore..
- 2. To push for the approval and implementation of the Zonal Development Plan by LLDA to bring some control and organization to the fishcages in Sampaloc Lake.
- 3. To develop a Tourism Master Plan that is sustainable and instrumental to the development of the City

## CURRENT ACTIVITIES/PROJECTS BY FSLF TO HELP REDUCE THE SOURCES OF POLLUTION IN SAMPALOC LAKE

- To develop a prototype Aquaponics system using high value vegetable and fresh water fish/crustaceans.
- To develop floating fish meal formula for local production by our local fisherfolk organization.
- To pilot the use of Green Filter or Constructed Wetlands technology in Sampaloc Lake.
- To produce a local cable TV show hosted and produced by the youth for the youth to discuss environmental issues. Its goal is not just to promote awareness, but to inspire the youth to play an active role as champions and stewards of the environment.

FSLF continues its campaign to provide environmental education and exposure among the youth in local, national, and international conferences...


